Says Jason Busch: "I am thrilled to have the opportunity to work beside Jason Jacques, who has been a friend and kindred spirit for more than a decade. His energy and creative mind are inspiring, as exemplified by his thought-provoking exhibitions and publications on 19th- and 20th-century ceramics, as well as the work of living artists. I look forward to our collaboration promoting artists today while also showcasing the relevance of historic objects to contemporary work.

Busch brings to his new role two decades of experience in the arts, serving as curator of decorative arts at the Wadsworth Atheneum Museum of Art and Minneapolis Institute of Art, chief curator at Carnegie Museum of Art, deputy director at the Saint Louis Art Museum, and division director for decorative arts at Sotheby's. He has fostered relationships with collectors across the country and secured significant gifts of art for museum collections, particularly in decorative arts, contemporary craft, and design. Busch received a Master of Arts degree from the Winterthur Program at the University of Delaware and a Bachelor of Arts degree in American Studies from Miami University. He was a 2013 Fellow at the Center for Curatorial Leadership in New York.

A contributor of articles on collections and exhibitions in *The Magazine Antiques* and *Antiques and Fine Art*, Busch has also curated several groundbreaking exhibitions on decorative arts and design and authored the associated publications, including: *Carnegie Museum of Art Decorative Arts and Design Collection Highlights*; *Currents of Change: Art and Life Along the Mississippi River, 1850-1861;* and *Inventing the Modern World: Decorative Arts at the World's Fairs, 1851-1939.*
